


Experimental studies have found harm to embryonic development.

Reproductive impacts include sperm damage and decreased ovarian follicles.




Trees and plants

EMF exposure can alter plant growth patterns and lead to thinner cell walls. A decade-long study documented significant tree damage from prolonged exposure to cell tower radiation.



Amphibians

Tadpoles exposed to cell tower radiation had altered behavior, asynchronous growth and a significantly higher mortality rate.



significant behavioral changes, including alterations in swimming patterns, anxietylike responses, and cognitive and memory deficits.
